Carol Regier, who joined the facility as a staff nurse, has served as executive director/CEO for the past 30 years. In addition to developing the first residential gambling addiction program in the state of South Dakota, Carol also played a key role in the creation of the facility's employee assistance program, Christian treatment program, and specialty programs for those who are struggling with opioid addiction, chronic pain, and dual diagnosis.

In 2002, the new adolescent unit at Keystone Treatment Center, which she helped design, was named after Carol.

Carol's many awards include the South Dakota Chemical Dependency Association's Distinguished Service Award for outstanding chemical dependency counselor in South Dakota and the Mitzi Carroll Award for continuing education and dedication in the field of treatment recovery.

In 2009, Carol was inducted into the South Dakota Hall of Fame.

Dr. Eugene Regier is an original board member of Keystone Treatment Center. He has 48 years of experience in chemical dependency medicine and 36 years in family practice medicine.

In addition to his work at Keystone Treatment Center, Eugene has served as chief of staff at Canton Inwood Hospital, medical director at Canton Good Samaritan Center, health officer of Lincoln County, and health director at the South Dakota State Penitentiary. In 2009, Eugene received the Mitzi Carroll Award for outstanding achievement in the field of chemical dependency. In 2017, he was honored as the public health employee of the year by the South Dakota State Health Department.

Carol and Eugene have both received the South Dakota Proud Angler Award for catching a trophy largemouth bass.
